



Who is practising vote bank politics?

Nowadays we find political outfits provoking people without understanding the need for the Uniform Civil Code under consideration by the Centre. It is not proper to have one law for one group and another one for another group. How can a house be run if one member of the family is bound by one law and another member by another law? Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while addressing booth-level BJP workers in Bhopal, passed the foregoing comments, which have historic significance. Modi has clarified the party's stance on the Uniform Civil Code. The BJP has been advocating Uniform Civil Code (UCC) for decades. It included UCC in its poll manifestoes for 1998 and 2019. Besides scrapping Article 370 relating to J and K and initiating the construction of the Ram temple in Ayodhya, the BJP has been advocating implementing

UCC across the nation for long. Upon being voted to power in 2014, Modi focussed on these three aspects. Consequently, initiation of Ram temple construction has been a success in Ayodhya and Article 370 has been scrapped in Kashmir. Now, the item on the agenda that is yet to be accomplished is UCC. Dr BR Ambedkar too had argued clearly that the citizens of the country should be bound by UCC. Other leaders like KM Munshi and Alladi Krishna Swamy Iyer also argued in favour of it. As per the Directive Principles of the State Policy, under Article 44, it is mentioned that UCC should be implemented across the nation. The Congress never bothered to pay attention to it. Adopting the British rule of divide and rule of Hindus and Muslims, the Congress indulged in vote bank politics.

When people of a certain faith are prohibited by law to practise bigamy, how can people of other faiths be allowed to practise it? Why should not people of all faiths follow the rule that sons and daughters enjoy equal rights to inherit the property from parents? Even in Sarala Mudgal case of 1995, the SC prohibited males to convert to Islam to take more than one wife. If UCC is in force, such undesirable developments could be checked, the apex court said.

The freedom to practice religion should be in tune with the honouring the Fundamental Rights of the people, gender equality and the right to dignified life, ruled the SC in 2018 while deciding a case pertained to the Indian Young Lawyers' Association. The apex court made it clear that the fundamental rights would prevail over religious traditions when the fundamental rights and religious traditions clash. Moreover, it said that people of no faith would have any right to conduct themselves according to their whims and fancies. The SC questioned the government as to why people should not have equal rights on issues like divorce, inheritance, adoption, and guardianship.

The Constitution advocated implementing UCC for all. The Union government offered to refer the issue to the 22nd Law Commission. The SC has been questioning the Union government for the past three years on the religious freedom of the people and personal laws. The Sabarimala case brought to the fore several aspects of the religious freedom of the people. At last, the 22nd Law Commission, issued notice to the people inviting their opinions on the enforcement of the UCC. It is atrocious to note that the Congress party kept the Muslims backward to use them for its vote bank politics and adopted an appeasement policy offering quota for Muslims, releasing funds to finance the Haj pilgrimage of Muslims, giving precedence to Muslim personal laws, not

prohibiting cow slaughter, ignored Hindus' clamour against growing Muslim population, and ignored the Ram Janmabhumi movement. Whereas the Narendra Modi government is firm to ensure that people enjoy their rights equally, irrespective of their religious background. As part of the exercise, the Centre freed Muslim women from triple talaq, using which Muslim men get rid of their wives. Like the Congress, the Trinamool Congress, the Samajwadi Party, MIM, YCP, and BRS also have been practising Muslim appeasement policies. These parties are not voicing their views before the Law Commission. The Congress found fault with the Law Commission going into the issue. Then, who is practising vote bank politics in this country? Who is driving a wedge between people of various faiths?

'Govt betrayed dairy farmers'

Surrendering Chittoor Dairy to Amul company is nothing but hitting the Telugu pride, said TDP AP president K Atchennaidu, on Monday. In an open letter to Chief Secretary, KS Jawahar Reddy, released to the media Atchennaidu expressed concern over surrendering thousands of acres worth public properties and cooperative dairies to Amul. He said that "Chief Minister, Jagan Mohan Reddy, who had promised to the people to revive the cooperative dairies, including the Chittoor Dairy, soon after coming to power, has changed tack after assum-



ing power terming as barbaric the 'surrendering' of the Chittoor Dairy to Amul in the name of reviving it." He said that the State Government is betraying the dairy farmers with its decisions, and pointed out that already public property worth Rs 6,000 crores have been conceded to the Amul. Jagan

has handed over the Chittoor Dairy to Amul for Rs 1 crore annual lease for 99 years and even its assets worth Rs 650 crore. Pointing out that the neighbouring States like Tamil Nadu and Karnataka have deliberately kept aside the Amul learning about its deceptive attitude, Atchennaidu said that Jagan Mohan Reddy, however, is acting as a brand ambassador of Amul. Atchennaidu felt that the State Government should stand by the cooperative dairies and should not hand over the Chittoor Dairy to Amul to save the public property from handing over to companies of other States.

The Nifty climbed 133.50 points or 0.70 per cent to end at a record high of 19,322.55. In intra-day trade, the benchmark zoomed 156.05 points or 0.81 per cent to hit its all-time intra-day peak of 19,345.10. "The market's record-breaking momentum continued as the robust June GST collections, and the monsoon covering most parts of the country in the last few days brought cheers to investors. The rally has been mostly due to strong foreign fund inflows and India performing well on most of the economic parameters could further strengthen the fund flows in the near term," Shrikant Chouhan, Head of Research (Retail), Kotak Securities Ltd, said. Market benchmarks settled at record highs for the third straight session on Monday. Reliance Industries was the top gainer in the Sensex chart, rising 2.53 per

cent, followed by ITC, Bajaj Finance, State Bank of India, HDFC, UltraTech Cement, NTPC, HDFC Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra, Tata Steel, Bajaj Finserv and ICICI Bank. In contrast, Power Grid, Maruti, Larsen & Toubro, Tata Consultancy Services, Tech Mahindra, Nestle and Tata Motors were among the laggards, skidding up to 1.86 per cent. As many as 1,972 stocks advanced while 1,721 declined and 147 remained unchanged on BSE. In the broader market, the BSE smallcap gauge climbed 0.56 per cent and the midcap index advanced 0.30 per cent. Among the indices, oil & gas jumped 2.28 per cent, energy rallied 2.08 per cent, metal (1.11 per cent), FMCG (1.09 per cent), financial services (1.02 per cent), realty (0.85 per cent), commodities (0.81 per cent) and bankex (0.78 per cent).

All these days AIMIM which depends on Muslims have been friendly with the BRS. Recently the MIM changed its tone regarding the BRS and is likely to get close to the Congress. In Telangana, the main adversary of the BRS is the Congress which is strongly opposing the UCC. If the BRS supports UCC Muslim voters will dump it in the coming Assembly and Lok Sabha elections. If the BRS opposes the UCC the BJP will play the Hindutva card against the BRS. Keeping in mind the sensitivity of the issue the BRS has reportedly taken a decision to remain neutral and to take a decision when the Bill comes for voting in Parliament. The decision of the Congress on the UCC has become a big problem for the BRS.

In Andhra Pradesh, for Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy the UCC is a lesser problem compared to his Telangana counterpart. In Andhra Pradesh, the Muslims are not as hostile to Hindus compared to Telangana. However, the UCC is a religious issue in AP also and Muslims will oppose it. As an indirect supporter of the Centre the Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister may support the UCC. The support of Jagan is crucial for the BJP in the Rajya Sabha to pass the Bill. Across the nation, political parties have decided their stand on the UCC. The AIMIM continuing its support for the BRS depends on the latter's decision on the UCC. There are already differences between the AIMIM and the BRS. If the BRS decides to support the UCC the AIMIM may dump the BRS.

Ensure quality ration to pregnant women: CM

Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy has instructed the officials to ensure high quality of take-home ration given to pregnant women and lactating mothers under 'YSR Sampoorna Poshana' and 'YSR Sampoorna Poshana Plus' schemes.

At a review meeting held by the Women Development and Child Welfare Department here on Monday, the Chief Minister said officials should develop SOPs on the distribution of groceries to ensure that quality material is delivered to all eligible mothers and women.

1 kg red gram, half kilo edible oil, 25 eggs and 5 liters milk are given under YSR Sampoorna Poshana Plus.

He also directed them to observe the first and third Fridays in every month as the day of health, sanitation and nutrition in every village and link these activities with the Family Doctor programme so that growth, vaccination, nutrition and children's habits can be monitored. Anganwadi supervisors also should participate in the monitoring programmes along with Family Doctors, he said.

Officials informed that steps are being taken to install equipment like salt scales, weighing machines and infant meters to monitor the growth of the children.

"For the present, this facility will be available at the Chief Justice's Court, Court Nos. 2 to 5, including corridor and Plaza in front, both waiting areas in front of plaza canteen and Press Lounge-I and II, with effect from 03.07.2023." Later, the top court, in a press statement, said that it has undertaken "futuristic

upgrades" as part of green initiatives for optimum use of technology in justice delivery systems.

"A series of futuristic upgrades have been implemented in Court No. 1 to 3 at the Supreme Court of India under the dynamic vision of the Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India, Dr Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud to enhance the use of technology in Judicial Systems," it said.

The enhancements in the courtrooms include installation of "a state-of-the-art Digital Video Conferencing (VC) system" to facilitate efficient communication and collaboration, it said.

"This system enables remote participation and virtual meetings, enhancing the accessibility and connectivity of the courtrooms. Cable cubbies have been integrated into these courtrooms to fulfil the diverse connectivity needs of modern technology.

Bapatla man drowns while rescuing his kids in US beach

A 42-year-old US-based software engineer from Andhra Pradesh drowned while rescuing his children at a beach in Florida, his family said on Monday. Potti Venkata Rajesh Kumar died around 4.30 am Indian Standard Time on Sunday, his younger brother P Vijay Kumar said. Rajesh Kumar was a native of Addanki mandal in Bapatla district of the State and was employed with a startup in the US.

The United States celebrates a long holiday coming in tandem with July 4th, which is the American Independence Day, and Rajesh decided to go out with family, his brother Vijay said, narrating the chain of events leading to his death.

Rajesh and his family went to Jacksonville beach in Florida. When he noticed that the children went further

into the sea, he ran behind them and managed to rescue his son. Yet, a big wave followed and pulled Rajesh in as well, his brother said. By the time Rajesh was brought back to the shore, Vijay said his brother was unconscious and immediately taken to a hospital in a helicopter, including his family members. Besides the father, his son also fell unconscious as water entered his lungs, said Vijay. At the hospital, Rajesh's son responded to shock treatment and is currently recovering in ICU but the software engineer died. The boy is conscious and able to talk, Vijay said.

According to Vijay, the Telugu Association of North America (TANA) in the US is chipping in to ensure the mortal remains of his brother return home while the Andhra Pradesh Non-Resident Telugu Society (APNRTS) has also been contacted locally for help and support.

YSRCP, TDP warned against continuing relations with BJP

They will face same fate as Shiv Sena and NCP, says CPM AP secretary

CPM State secretary V Srinivasa Rao has warned the ruling YSRCP and Opposition TDP that if they continue their friendship with the BJP, they will face the same fate as the Shiv Sena and the Nationalist Congress Party in Maharashtra.

These three parties neglected the Polavaram project-displaced people and rehabilitation colonies, he alleged. The BJP-led Central government betrayed Andhra Pradesh by not releasing funds for the displaced people and R&R colonies, he added.

The Left leader underlined the attitude of the BJP and warned both the ruling and Opposition parties about the saffron party. If these parties blindly follow the BJP, they will



split like Shiv Sena and NCP. The BJP aims to rule the country as well as the States and for that, the saffron party will focus on snatching power from the ruling parties by creating splits, he alleged.

He warned that the YSRCP and the TDP in the State should be wary of the BJP and maintain a distance from that party. In view of the coming elections in the country, the BJP-led Central government is

trying to bring the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) Bill in the next Parliament sessions. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is trying to get back in power by splitting people in the name of religion, he added.

Coming to the Polavaram project, the previous TDP government also neglected the displaced people and R&R colonies, he said. Now, the YSRCP is following the previous government and not allo-

61% increase in PLF: APERC

The meeting was attended by K Vijayanand, Special Chief Secretary Energy, and KVN Chakradhar Babu, Managing Director of APGENCO, along with APERC Chairman Justice C V Nagarajuna Reddy.

During the meeting, the performance of the power sector, including standards of performance, was critically assessed. The ongoing capital works aimed at meeting future load growth and ensuring uninterrupted 24x7 power supply were also reviewed across all utilities.

APERC Chairman Justice CV Nagarajuna Reddy commended APGENCO for achieving a significant increase in the Plant Load Factor (PLF) compared to the previous year. Andhra Pradesh Power Development Corporation Limited (APPDCL) registered a 61% PLF, compared to 41% during the same period last year. The APERC Chairman, along with members PVR Reddy and Thakur Rama Singh, advised APGENCO to take necessary steps to further increase the PLF and achieve industry-best standards.

The Commission directed the completion of all essential network-related works covering all voltages by December 2023. Additionally, efforts were

In terms of accidents and compensation, APERC recommended that utilities demonstrate compassion and generosity while granting ex gratia payments. The commission emphasized the need for comprehensive safety mea-

conduct the programmes in the state and also planned to organise Language Brahmothsavam with the support of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD). The Uttarandhra Literary meetings will be conducted soon with the support of Andhra University in Visakhapatnam. He said those who do not follow the guidelines of the authority will be fined to the tune of Rs 10,000 to Rs 60,000 but will take the reports from all the collectors and officials about the problems faced during the implementation of the Telugu Language at the ground level.

He said that they also suggested to all the municipal commissioners to assure all the signboards of the business sector should be in the Telugu language.

Jagan doing nothing for R'seema: Byreddy

If the Sangamithra project had been completed, 24 lakh acres would have been provided to get water. Hospet Dam and Krishna projects have gone to Ballari district. Leaders of Royalaseema have done great injustice to this region, he alleged.

"Due to the construction of the Upper Bhadra (Karnataka)

Meanwhile, he alleged that Jagan's flag and agenda were different and added that his focus was only on getting out of CBI cases. He alleged that CM Jagan was in depression. He was not even in the mood for thinking about the State. Byreddy also alleged that at present, the entire State was talking about the Vivekananda Reddy murder case.

Referring to the Amma Vodi scheme, he pointed out that the amount had not been credited so far and that CM Jagan was cheating the public. He also stated that due to the merger of the elementary schools, many children's education was affected. He said that CM Jagan had screwed up the education system in the State.

Will Satya Kumar replace Veerraju as AP BJP chief?

BJP-TDP alliance may become a reality in case of change of guard

Additionally, in Telangana, there are similar talks about the likely replacement of the present state unit BJP president, Bandi Sanjay, with Union Minister Kishan Reddy.

been closely associated with Vice President Venkaiah Naidu, serving as his personal assistant for an extensive period.

If Satya Kumar assumes the role of BJP AP state unit president, there is a possibility of BJP and the Telugu Desam Party forming an alliance for the upcoming 2024 elections. TDP chief Chandrababu

president, it could further solidify the prospects of an alliance between the two parties ahead of the elections. Political analysts also point out that there is pressure from BJP MP Sujana Chowdary and other leaders who joined the BJP after the 2019 elections from the TDP to establish an alliance with the TDP before the upcoming elections.

Ajit Pawar's entry into the State Cabinet exposes fissures in the NCP

The recent inclusion of Ajit Pawar, a prominent leader of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), in the cabinet as Deputy CM has sent shockwaves through Maharashtra's political landscape. Ajit's return to the fold after his brief and controversial alliance with the BJP last year has highlighted the deep-rooted divisions within the NCP. This unexpected move has raised concerns about the party's internal dynamics and the impact it may have on its future trajectory. 
Tradition of sruti, smriti and Sengol

Perception and inference are valid sources of knowledge in the Indian traditions and so must be respected

Recently, India witnessed the establishment of the historic 'Sengol' in her new building of the parliament. The ceremony verily is the demonstration of our civilisational journey and re-discovering the ancient tradition once practised. The 'Sengol' is not a symbol of power, or lustre that is passed on from one generation to another rather it envelops a much wider connotation with deep philosophic meanings. The 'Sengol' as a concept is deeply rooted in the idea of 'Aram' - the Tamil equivalent of 'Dharma'. Saint Tiruvalluvar, in his timeless 'Thirukkural', sings the glorification of 'Sengonmai' as 'rule with justice', which is one of the most precious achievements of the Indic civilisation.



The 'Sengol', or the Staff or the Sceptre, is the foundation or support of all virtues and ethics essential for the state. The establishment was a moment of joy, pleasure, and pride for most of us. But some people doubted its grandeur and importance and also questioned its historicity. Being ignorant of our rich Indic tradition of 'Sruti and Smriti', such people sought the justification of this entire ceremony. To understand the significance of Sengol, it is necessary to sweep over the tradition of Sruti and Smriti.

One of the distinctive features of India is her preservation and dissemination of knowledge for almost five thousand years at least. India bestows utmost importance on knowledge, and that is why India is known as a 'knowledge culture'. This knowledge tradition is beyond the boundaries of any spatiotemporal relationship (desatita and kalatita) as well as continuous (nirantara). The entire outlook of Indian knowledge tradition is an interplay of Sruti and Smriti. There is a very intricate relationship between Sruti and the Smriti. The Brihaspati Smriti perceives these two as the two eyes for the men of wisdom and deprived of these two, one may lose their path and fall.

Since the Vedas are transmitted orally and are perceptible to the auditory sense, it is termed Sruti. It means 'learning by hear-

ing' which is the primary revelation at the beginning of creation. This revelation was 'seen' by the primaeva seers; on the other hand, Smriti means 'recollection' and is the collective term for all other sacred literature which is considered to be secondary to Sruti (Van Buitenen, 1974). Revelation is the inner visualisation of the true nature of various entities and their attributes. Vedic seers acquired this revelation through a progressive self-culture (atma-sanskara). Sruti statements are considered infallible and hence are authoritative.

In his book 'Freedom at Midnight', Dominique Lapierre and Larry Collins remind us of the above-mentioned ritual that happened at sundown on 14th August 1947 in Delhi. This pious ritual ended with chanting 11 verses of Kolaru Pathigam - a Tamil text - to instil good thoughts in mind.

Indian philosophical tradition accepts Sruti as the only means of Dharma. Sruti as well as Smriti are regarded as valid means of knowledge. Sruti provides a firm foundation for all knowledge traditions, and practices. Regarding the validity of Smritis, the Mimamsa School of philosophy presents

an enriching argument by saying that "if the Smriti writers knew a certain action that should not be done, how could they declare it to be one that should be done, and thus mislead the contemporary society? One may argue that some sort of memory of the Sruti provides the necessary foundation for Smriti writers to codify some acts. But such memory is also not possible in the absence of some previous perception. The Smritis cannot be solely based on memory because memory demands previous cognition or experience. Continual of some sort of cultural memory also does not authenticate them. On the other side, the memory of the Vedas is not authenticated merely by its unbroken tradition but by the fact that the Vedas are perceptible to us during its recitation. In the case of Smriti, no such prior cognition is available to support their theories and practices.


Indian tradition accepts Smriti as reliable based on inference (anumana) which is a valid source of knowledge. The reason behind such inference is the fact that 'the agent is the same', i.e., the author of the concerned Smriti and the performer of the acts prescribed by the Sruti are the

same individual. It is also quite reasonable to accept that knowledge of Sruti texts is remembered, while certain Sruti texts and their wordings may be now lost. Different philosophical schools answer this question differently. The Mimamsa School assumes that Smritis are derived from Vedic texts now forgotten or inaccessible to us currently. In this way, Smriti, through inference, becomes the source of valid knowledge.

Perception and Inference, thus, are valid sources of knowledge in the Indian culture. Amidst the looming controversies surrounding the tradition of 'Sengol', its cultural validity can be significantly proven through the institutional memory that rests with the Adheenams of Tamil Nadu. In the present context, the tradition of handing over Sengol as a symbolic transfer of power is an inalienable cultural embodiment of the Sruti-Smriti tradition of ancient India. Its reiteration in modern India and symbolic placement in the new Indian parliament signifies the cultural awakening and echoes the civilisational idioms in the 21st century.

India to become largest toymaker in the world

India makes toys worth USD 1.5 billion and is soon would be the world's largest toy maker but there are many challenges on the way, including of quality and pricing



India is poised to replace Chinese toys with indigenous manufacturing touching \$ 1.5 billion. It is likely to double to \$ 3.3 billion by 2028, according to International Market Analysis Research and Consulting Group (IMARC Group). India's toy imports, according to official figures, have declined by more than 70 per cent in the past 3.5 years, while exports have jumped by 61.3 per cent. It is expected to grow at a 12 per cent compound annual growth rate (CAGR). The world's leading toymaker Mattel recalled over 21 million Chinese-made toys worldwide in 2007 due to excessive levels of lead paint and other unsafe components.

India first banned toy imports from China mainly for its toxicity on 23 Jan 2009 but again eased it on 6 March 2009. The Narendra Modi government has put restrictions again on September 1, 2017.

Despite all this as per WTO norms a complete ban on toy imports is unlikely.

A new government initiative promises to help Indian toymakers scale up production capacity to compete internationally, further shrinking China's share in the domestic market. The government is considering a special scheme for the toy industry, according to Ajay Aggarwal, president of the Toy Association of India. It is likely to be a production-linked incentive. It will spur the activities of the toy industry.

India is home to 25 per cent of the world's children aged between 0 and 12 years. Domestic demand is huge. It also has a rich history and culture when it comes to toy making. India's toy industry has been a rare bright spot in the country's drive to cut import reliance on China in recent years. Various policies to reduce dependence on Chinese goods and boost local manufacturing have been initiated while taking advan-

tage of Western efforts to diversify from the world's No 2 economy, says an International Labour Organisation study.

India's share in the global toy market, estimated at \$90 billion, is 0.5 per cent (\$500 million). The toy manufacturers are mostly located in NCR, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and clusters in some other states.

Chitrakoot in Uttar Pradesh, Kondapalli in Andhra Pradesh, Tanjore dolls, Ghurni clay dolls, Rajasthani puppets and Chennai-patna on the Bengaluru-Mysuru highway have an age-old tradition of toy making but are unable to keep up with modern scale and trends. The traditional craft is protected as a geographical indication (GI) under the World Trade Organization. These are in demand in the West as exquisite pieces of art. India's domestic toy industry comprises 4,000 micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) and is primarily in the unorganized sector.

The increasing population catalyses the demand for toys. In addition, inflating income levels and the rising awareness among individuals about the benefits of toys in improving the cognitive capabilities of children are positively influencing the market in the country. Apart from this, a shifting preference from conventional toys towards modern and hi-tech electronic toys is strengthening the market growth. In line with this, the escalating demand for sensory toys for kids with special needs is driving the market in India, the ILO notes

Advanced technology and machinery encourage manufacturers to produce innovative toys and boost the market outlook. The rising sales of smartphones, laptops, and personal computers (PCs), along with the increasing influence of social media, are propelling market growth.

Amazon sold \$ 6292 million worth of toys, Walmart \$ 4645 million and Target \$ 1621 million through e-commerce. India's import of toys in the financial year 2018-2019 stood at \$1.4 billion (Rs10,000 crore). Almost 85 per cent of the toys 2020 sold in India are imported, with China being the top source, followed by Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Germany, Hong Kong and the US.

A large variety of toys are available within the Indian market, they can be broadly classified into two very distinct categories based on their application & purpose - educational and recreational toys. Amongst these two categories, under educational toys various toys and games made out of plastics and cardboard materials are prominent, while recreational toys, including electronic toys - remote controls, video games, battery operated toys, cars, plastic toys, dolls, soft toys and mechanical pull back toys are not popular amongst modern parents. However, out of all of these toys, electronic toys & games as well as battery-operated toys are being manufactured less in India.

The markets still sell Chinese products as still these are considered to have beheld the buyer. The Indian toys, despite being less expensive, are supposedly of better quality and have yet to carve out a

niche in the market. There is a perception that the imported are technologically better. Manufacturers say that at initial stages the reactions are normal but as the indigenous products proliferate the perception would change.

Manufacturers find that while they have started mainly plastic toys as it is easier, they face different kinds of problems. It is just not the kind of metals and plastics but many toys need different kinds of textiles and other accessories. The ancillaries are yet to come up. Some require particular kinds of durable, light and special fabric. That too is not locally available. China has also advanced the low-cost electronics industry.

However, they are expecting more government support for banning imports to sustain production. A KPMG-FICCI report is hopeful that the country's market size would be doubling to \$ 2 billion shortly. Electronic toys comprise about ten per cent of the toy segment, it is hoped that even without them the rest of the segment would grow and gradually critical areas would also be covered.

The Ministry of Commerce and Industry is trying to understand the dynamics and shortcomings. It is also looking at the experience of other countries. It is working with the Toy Association of India.

Overall a good import substitution move has been made and the government expects the sector to leap by 2028. The Ministry of Commerce thinks that in the next few years Indian toy industry would compete with China and have a niche in the world market.

Basic Structure Doctrine: Its genesis and Indian Parliament

The Basic Structure Doctrine should balance its ambit concerning the powers of Parliament, as it is the biggest forum of representative democracy

This year in April, we celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Basic Structure Doctrine. Basic Structure doctrine is used by constitutional courts in our country to interpret provisions of our constitution and other laws which further drive us to the conclusion about the amendments of constitution or new laws, whether they are constitutional or unconstitutional.

Though few jurists attribute this doctrine to J. Mudholkar wherein his lordship in Sajjan Singh's case used the word "basic feature". He cited a case from Pakistan, where it was held that essential features of the constitution cannot be amended (Fazlul Quader Chaudhary v. Mohd. Abdul Haque). Another branch of jurists

advocates that Basic Structure is attributed to the lecture delivered by Sir Dieter Conrad, a German jurist at Banaras Hindu University. The lecture was used by the great jurist M K Nambiar in Golaknath's case wherein he watered the seeds of Basic Structure, which already existed in our constitution, which will be explained later in this article by drawing an analogy from German's Basic Law. Shri M K Nambiar holds the distinction of arguing this doctrine for the first time in India.

Basic Structure doctrine cannot be analyzed without taking into account the Constitution of Germany which is called Basic Law. Article 19 of the Basic Law restricts certain rights as and when any situation arises. It is



pertinent to note that sub-clause (2) of Article 19, acting as a proviso to sub-clause (1) explicitly mentions that "In no case the essence of Basic Rights be affected". From here we can derive that to much extent, though unknowingly our Basic Structure doctrine is inspired

by Basic Law. Adding further to it, Article 19(4) of basic law guarantees, what we call in India the right to Legal Remedies. Article 10(2) of Basic Law puts some restrictions in furtherance of law when there is a need to protect the basic democratic order of

the country. Article 19(4) mentions that Article 10(2) cannot curtail the right of legal remedy.

There is a whole maze of events in this. In the Indian Constitution, we have a provision under Article 32(4) that mentions that rights under Article 32 (legal remedy) cannot be suspended except and otherwise provided by this constitution. Article 32 is termed as "Heart and Soul" of our constitution by Dr Ambedkar. This is because it is upon this right, our part III of the constitution gets enforced if violated by the state or its functionaries. It means, without using the words like "essential feature" or "Basic Structure" our constitution too has taken up the need to protect certain rights essential

for a civilized country. Basic Structure was there since inception, it is another issue that was first argued explicitly in Golaknath's case.

Therefore, delving into a debate about the fact that who introduced this doctrine in India is a futile debate. Rather we should understand that there are certain rights essential for humankind irrespective of borders. It is not to credit or discredit someone's effort as to who used it first but to thank every advocate and judge who used it at any point in time, which resulted in an honest effort to protect the rights of individuals or society.

As Indian polity is not that smooth, the rift between government and judiciary led to various litigations where the ambit of Basic Structure was

widened. A recent interview given by Shri K K Venugopal rightly raises the caution that frequent usage of this doctrine has left parliament groping in the dark. Elaborating on the same, he added, the manner this doctrine was used in the NJAC case, undermined the intention of our Constituent Assembly members concerning the appointment of judges in constitutional courts.

Therefore, it is required that the Basic Structure Doctrine should balance its ambit concerning the powers of parliament, as it is the biggest forum of representative democracy. This doctrine has protected the rights of society and individuals but a caution to its usage is required to protect the interest of representative democracy as well.

SpiceJet repays Rs 100 cr loan to City Union Bank

Embattled airline SpiceJet on Monday said it has repaid the Rs 100 crore loan taken from the City Union Bank and the payment of the last tranche of Rs 25 crore was done in June. The repayment of the loan amount releases all securities that had been pledged with the bank, the no-frills airline said in a statement. In recent times, the airline has been facing multiple headwinds, including petitions for insolvency proceedings against it and in some cases, lessors taking back leased aircraft. According to the carrier, it has successfully completed the settlement of payment of Rs 100 crore to City Union Bank. The last tranche of Rs 25 crore was paid on June 30, "successfully closing the entire loan account which was taken in the year 2012", it added. Earlier, the airline had reached a settlement agreement with Nordic Aviation Capital (NAC), a major lessor for its Q400 aircraft. The agreement with NAC settles all past liabilities for the Q400s leased by NAC to SpiceJet.



Senco IPO price band at Rs 301-317 per share

Jewellery retail major Senco Gold Ltd has fixed a price band of Rs 301 to Rs 317 for its Rs 405 crore initial public offering (IPO), which will open for public subscription on July 4, the company said on Monday. The initial share sale will conclude on July 6 and the bidding for anchor investors will open on July 3, according to the Red Herring Prospectus. The bids have to be made for a minimum of 47 shares of Rs 10 each and multiples thereof. The Senco IPO comprises a fresh issue of equity shares aggregating up to Rs 270 crore and an offer-for-sale of equity shares to the tune of Rs 135 crore by selling shareholder SAIF Partners India IV Ltd, the RHP said. At present, SAIF Partners has 19.23 per cent stake in the jewellery retail chain. It will be offloading its stake by 8-9 per cent in this issue, Senco managing director and CEO Suvankar Sen said.



Investcorp makes addl Rs 500 cr investment in NDR Warehousing

Investcorp, a global investment manager specialising in alternative investments, has pumped in Rs 500 crore more into NDR Warehousing. This is the second investment that the fund has made into the warehouse development and operating platform. It had invested USD 55 million last year, the fund said in a statement Monday. Investcorp's India real estate team invests in real estate projects located in top tier cities and so far, it has deployed over USD 350 million across the warehousing, residential and education related sectors broadly with a social infrastructure focus. NDR has a diversified asset portfolio comprising warehouses across 10 cities including Chennai, Mumbai, Coimbatore and Kolkata, offering over 14 million square feet area with an aggregate occupancy rate of over 95 per cent. It also has around 5 million square feet under construction. NDR is considering listing part of its warehousing portfolio as an Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvIT) later this year.



76% of Rs 2,000 notes valued at Rs 2.72L cr returned to banks:RBI

As much as 76 per cent of the Rs 2,000 currency notes in circulation have either been deposited or exchanged at banks, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said on Monday and asked the public to turn in the remaining notes before September 30.



RBI said 87% of the notes returned have been deposited in bank accounts by public while the remaining 13 per cent were exchanged by them in other denominations.

In value terms, Rs 2,000 notes in circulation has come down to Rs 84,000 crore as on June 30 from Rs 3.56 lakh crore on the day of announcement of withdrawal on May 19.

In a statement, RBI said 87 per cent of the notes returned have been deposited in bank accounts by public while the remaining 13 per cent were exchanged by them in other denominations.

The central bank, in a surprise move, on May 19 announced withdrawal of Rs 2,000 notes from circulation but gave public time till September 30 to either deposit such notes in accounts or exchange them at banks.

Unlike the November 2016 shock demonetisation when

old Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 notes were invalidated overnight, the Rs 2,000 notes will continue to be a legal tender till September 30.

The total value of Rs 2,000 banknotes in circulation, which amounted to Rs 3.62 lakh crore as on March 31, 2023, had declined to Rs 3.56 lakh crore as at the close of business on May 19, 2023.

"According to the data received from the banks, the total value of Rs 2,000 bank notes received back from circulation after the announcement on May 19 is Rs 2.72 lakh crore up to June 30, 2023.

"Consequently, Rs 2,000 bank notes in circulation as at the close of business on June 30 stood at Rs 0.84 lakh crore. Thus, 76 per cent of the Rs 2,000 bank notes in circulation as on May 19, 2023 have since been returned," the central bank said in a statement.

Further, RBI said that data collected from major banks indicates that out of the total bank notes in Rs 2,000 denomination received back from circulation, about 87 per cent is in the form of deposits and the remaining around 13 per cent has been exchanged into other denomination bank

notes. "Members of the public are requested to utilise the next three months to deposit and/or exchange the Rs 2,000 bank notes held with them to avoid any rush in the last few days before September 30, 2023," it added. It may be noted that RBI has not yet clarified what would be the status of Rs 2,000 notes in private hands after September 30. After announcing demonetisation in 2016, the government had made it an offence to hold the withdrawn Rs 500 and 1,000 notes (beyond a specified limit) after expiry of the deposit deadlines.

ED questions Anil Ambani in fresh FEMA case

Reliance ADA Group Chairman Anil Ambani on Monday appeared before the Enforcement Directorate (ED) here and recorded his statement in connection with an investigation linked to the alleged contravention of the foreign exchange law, official sources said. Ambani, 64, deposited at the office of the federal agency in south Mumbai. Ambani's statement was recorded as part of a fresh case filed under various sections of the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA), the sources said without elaborating. The industrialist had appeared before the ED in 2020 in a money laundering case against Yes Bank promoter Rana Kapoor and others.

In August last year, the income-tax department issued a notice to Ambani under the anti-black money law for allegedly evading Rs 420 crore in taxes on undisclosed funds of more than Rs 814 crore held in two Swiss bank accounts.

E-commerce operators face problem in GST drive to check fake registration

The pan-India drive against fake GST registration has created problems for e-commerce companies which maintain virtual offices in various states with minimal staff and no books of accounts.

Talking to PTI, MakeMyTrip Group Vice President -Taxation Tajinder Singh said that the GST officials should enquire with the head offices with regard to virtual offices before categorising the state registration as a fake entity for non-production of books of accounts.

"We maintain virtual offices in states...in this fake registration drive the field offices have mistook these offices as fake registration, however we were only using these offices for tax payment, there was no ITC flow or fraud being committed using those registration. Because of this, lot of registration were blocked for compliance purpose and that created problems for us," Singh said.

Centre and state GST authorities have on May 16 launched a two-month drive to check fake registration under



Goods and Services Tax (GST). The fake registrations are mainly taken to defraud the exchequer by wrongfully claiming Input Tax Credit (ITC).

In this drive, 45,000 fake registrations have been identified and evasion worth Rs 13,000 crore detected. Also, wrongful availing of ITC worth Rs 1,430 crore has been blocked.

Singh said that the field offices should take into account the fact that virtual offices are maintained with a few staff and often they do not attend office everyday. The virtual office with a place of address is created only to comply with state GST laws and are not meant to claim wrongful

ITC. "When field officers come to this virtual offices, they will not find physical presence of employees and in that sense they would say nothing is there. After going back they will send us emails and we provide them the information. All the information is available, all the records are available. It may not be readily available when they approach the office," Singh added.

The e-commerce companies have been representing to the GST authorities that they should be allowed to keep the headoffice address for registration in states to help them do away with the requirement of having a physical presence or maintaining a physical office.



Co-living startup Settl FY23 revenue jumps two-fold

Co-living operator Settl has clocked over two-fold jump in its revenue last fiscal to nearly Rs 17 crore and plans to expand its capacity by 2.5 times to 5,000 beds by March next year.

The company, which focuses on providing quality rental accommodations to working professionals, currently has around 2,000 beds at 40 centres across Bengaluru, Gurugram and Hyderabad.

It is now looking to enter the Noida, Pune and Chennai markets, Settl said in a statement on Monday.

The Bengaluru-based startup charges between Rs 12,000 and Rs 18,000 per bed.

"We are currently present in three cities dominated by IT firms. We are now actively looking at entering Noida, Pune and Chennai where a lot of professionals are working in IT and other sectors. We antic-

ipate strong demand for quality co-living centre in these cities," Settl co-founder Abhishek Tripathi said.

The company is in an advanced stage of discussion with a few property owners in three cities where it has a presence as well as three new markets. The agreements are likely to be signed by September.

Settl said it has adopted an asset-light model and partners with property owners, instead of taking facilities on pure rental basis. This helps it to expand at a fast pace.

"The co-living segment was one of the worst affected sectors because of the closure of offices and educational institutions. But, it has bounced back sharply with employees returning to office fully or in hybrid mode," Tripathi said.

Employees will need rental accommodations in cities even if they have to go to the office for 2 days a week, he said.

Oil companies to turn profitable on fuel marketing in FY24: Fitch

State-owned oil marketers are likely to turn profitable on fuel marketing in the current fiscal ending on March 31, 2024, following large losses in the previous year, Fitch Ratings said on Monday.

The rating agency expects India's petroleum product demand to grow by mid-single digit percentage in the medium term, supported by forecast that the GDP will grow by 6-7 per cent in the next few years, the government's increasing

spending on infrastructure and a pick-up in industrial activity.

"We expect the Indian oil marketing companies' marketing segment to turn profitable from the financial year ending March 2024 (FY24) as crude oil prices fall to Fitch's assumption of USD 78.8 per barrel, following large losses in FY23 due to high crude prices and unchanged retail fuel prices," it said.

This should enable the oil marketing companies (OMCs) to partly recoup the FY23



(April 2022 to March 2023) losses in first half of FY24, before the fall in crude prices in recent months is reflected in retail prices.

The government previously

allowed the recovery of such losses in subsequent periods, before reversing the suspension of daily price resets.

State-owned retailers Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat

Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) did not raise petrol and diesel prices last year despite rise in crude oil prices. With oil prices now receding, they are now recouping the losses.

Fitch Ratings expected India's petroleum product demand in the financial year ending March 2024 (FY24) to grow by a mid-single digit percentage after a 10 per cent rise in FY23, which was aided by the post-pandemic pent-up demand.

India's coal output grows 8.40%

India's total coal production rose 8.40 per cent to 222.93 million tonne (MT) in April-June 2023-24, an official statement said on Monday.

The country's overall coal output was 205.65 MT in the year-ago quarter, the Ministry of Coal said.

Captive mines/others registered a growth of 4.74 per cent to 30.48 MT in Q1 FY24, from 29.10 MT in Q1 FY23.

The cumulative coal dispatch grew 6.97 per cent to 239.69 MT in Q1 this fiscal compared to 224.08 MT in Q1 of FY23.

The total coal stock, as of June 30, 2023, surged 37.62 per cent to 107.15 MT (provisional) from 77.86 MT a year ago.

"This growth indicates the continued efforts to meet the rising demand for coal," the ministry said.

State-owned Coal India Limited (CIL) has recorded 9.85 per cent growth, with production reaching 175.35 MT in Q1 FY24 compared to 159.63 MT a year ago.

India will not face any coal shortage this year, even during the monsoon, Coal and Mines Minister Pralhad Joshi said last month.

Govt calls off strategic sale of Pawan Hans as winning bidder disqualified

The government on Monday decided to call off the strategic disinvestment of Pawan Hans as the successful bidding consortium Star9 Mobility Pvt Ltd was disqualified in view of pending legal cases.

Pawan Hans is a 51:49 joint venture of the government and ONGC. The government had in April last year decided to sell the helicopter service provider for Rs 211.14 crore to Star9 Mobility Pvt Ltd -- a consortium of Big Charter Private Ltd, Maharaja Aviation Private Ltd and Almas Global Opportunity Fund SPC.

However, in May the sale



process was put on hold after it came to light that the lead member of the winning bidder consortium -- Almas Global Opportunity Fund SPC -- has a case pending against it at the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT).

In a statement, the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) on Monday said the government has examined the adverse orders of

NCLT and NCLAT.

"After careful consideration of the response of the successful bidder to the show cause notice, with the approval of alternative mechanism...the government has decided that successful bidding consortium M/s Star 9 Mobility Pvt Ltd is disqualified from the process of strategic disinvestment of Pawan Hans Ltd... Further, the current EoI process for strategic disinvestment stands annulled," the DIPAM said.

Alternative Mechanism comprises Minister of Road Transport & Highways, Minister of Finance and Minister of Civil Aviation.

BSE-listed firms' market valuation touches record high of Rs 298.21L cr

The market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms reached a record high of Rs 298.21 lakh crore on Monday as the benchmark Sensex ended above the 65,000-mark for the first time ever amid bullish investor sentiments.

The benchmark index jumped 486.49 points or 0.75 per cent to settle at its all-time closing high of 65,205.05 points. During the day, the benchmark rallied 581.79 points or 0.89 per cent to scale its record intra-day peak of 65,300.35 points.

Sensex rallied for the fourth straight trading session on Monday. Thanks to the ongoing record-breaking rally in equities, the market capitalisation (mcap) of BSE-listed companies jumped to Rs 2,98,21,576.81 crore. Investors' wealth have gone up by Rs 7.54 lakh crore in four days of market rally.

On Friday, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms touched an all-time high of Rs 296.48 lakh crore. From the Sensex pack, Reliance Industries was the biggest gainer, climbing 2.53 per cent, followed by ITC, Bajaj Finance, State Bank of India, HDFC, UltraTech Cement, NTPC, HDFC Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra, Tata Steel, Bajaj Finserv and ICICI Bank.

White-collar hiring in India sees 3% decline

White-collar hiring in India witnessed 3 per cent decline in June as sectors such as IT, Retail, BPO, Education, FMCG and Insurance also showed cautious hiring sentiments, a report said on Monday.

According to the Naukri JobSpeak Index, on a year-on-year basis, June witnessed a 3 per cent decline with 2,795 job postings compared to 2,878 in June 2022. On a month-on-month basis, the job postings fell by 2 per cent.

The Naukri JobSpeak is a monthly Index representing the state of the Indian job market & hiring activity based on new job listings and job-

related searches by recruiters on the resume database of Naukri.com.

"The white collar job market of India is witnessing a structural shift. For a long time, jobs in the tech sector and in top metros were the key drivers of white collar job growth.

"Of late, jobs in the emerging sectors such as real estate, oil and gas, pharma and BFSI have emerged as significant contributors to job growth," Naukri.com Chief Business Officer Pawan Goyal added.

As per the report, the IT industry hiring continued to remain an area of concern, with a 31 per cent decline in new jobs created compared to June last year.



The decline in hiring was prominent across all types of IT companies, including global tech giants, large IT services companies, tech-focused startups and unicorns, the report

noted. While traditional roles such as Software Developers and System Analysts continued to witness a downturn, niche roles such as Cybersecurity Analysts and AI Specialists

showed positive hiring trends, bucking the negative trend across most other tech roles, said the report.

Besides IT, sectors such as Retail, BPO, Education, FMCG and Insurance also showed cautious hiring sentiments.

However, the report revealed that the Oil and Gas sector continued its bull run with 40 per cent growth in new jobs compared to June last year in line with the rapid refinery expansion and supporting roles to meet the increased domestic and export demand.

Similarly, the Pharma sector surged with a 14 per cent growth in new jobs compared to June last year.

Automobile, Hospitality, and

Banking were some of the other sectors witnessing positive hiring sentiments.

The Naukri JobSpeak Index also found that diversification of white-collar jobs to non-metro cities continued apace.

Ahmedabad topped the list with an unprecedented 23 per cent growth in employment compared to June last year, followed by Vadodara with 14 per cent growth, while Jaipur continued to hold steady.

On the other hand, it said, hiring activity continued to dip across large IT-driven metros, except Mumbai, which held steady compared to June 2022, primarily driven by the Oil and Gas and Hospitality sector.

IIFL Finance raises US\$ 175 mn via ECB route

Non-banking finance company IIFL Finance has raised USD 175 million through external commercial borrowing (ECB) route.

IIFL Finance said it has raised USD 75 million from HSBC and USD 50 million each from Union Bank's Sydney branch and Bank of Baroda's IFSC unit.

With this debt raising, IIFL Finance has raised USD 275 million in ECB since March this year when it had mopped up 100 million from the Export Development Canada and Deutsche Bank Singapore. These funds are long-term

in nature and will help the company further strengthen its asset liability position and support growth, besides helping diversify its borrowing sources and lower the company's overall borrowing costs, Kapish Jain, the group CFO said.

The money has been priced at SOFR (secured overnight financing rate) plus 200 bps, IIFL Finance said in a statement.

The main difference between SOFR and Libor is how the rates are arrived at. While Libor is based on a panel bank input, SOFR is a broad measure of the cost of borrowing overnight collateralized by US treasury securities in the repo market.

Nana Patekar to lend his voice to *Gadar 2*

The attachment of SRK's film's trailer to Tom Cruise's film is quite interesting as both the megastars command a similar fan following across the globe and are known for their charm.


The film has set its release date for September 7, this year.



FROM BOLLYWOOD TO HOLLYWOOD:

Fostering the art of dance and connecting hearts through it

International Award-winning multi-hyphenated artist Joya Nandy Kazy wears multiple hats, from being a choreographer and actress to an educator. Joya, who recently made it to the news once again for her choreography in *Never Have I Ever* season 4, takes *The Pioneer* on an exclusive journey of her formative years and achievements.

No matter where they go, Indians are always Indians at heart! We've heard this a lot of times, didn't we? But today, we bring to you our interaction with Joya Nandy Kazi, who is currently based in Los Angeles.

However, her inclination towards Indian art and culture has made her one of the most sought-after choreographers in Hollywood.

Well, let's take you to the flashback of her journey! Growing up, Joya had always had an affinity for music, rhythm, and dance. How could she not? There wasn't a single day in her house when her parents didn't play the music of Kishore Kumar, Lata Mangeshkar, R.D. Burman, Michael Jackson, Madonna, and Elvis, out of the many. The moment that she really got captivated by Indian classical music was when, for the first time, she saw an Odissi dancer performing in Michael Jackson's *Black-and-White* music video on MTV. It's surely going to be safe to say that the majority of us have been smitten with Michael Jackson every time we've seen him perform. Humorously, she recalled, "I thought if I could dance like the Odissi dancer

whom I saw in the video, I could marry Michael Jackson and travel the world with him (she laughs out loud.) I immediately told my mom about the dancer and my desire to dance like her. Within a few days, my mom found a very amazing Odissi dance teacher."

You'd not believe it when we say that she was just three years old when this happened. And as she turned four, her dance journey began. Odissi being the first dance form that she learned, she went on to learn Kathak, Bharatanatyam, Kuchipudi, Manipuri, and Kathakali as well. Apart from studying Indian classical dances, Joya has also studied Hindustani classical music singing and instruments, including Guitar, Tabla, Flute, Violin, and Piano. She was also a member of the school band. So, this surely sums up that music, art, and dance have always been huge parts of her life.

Later, as she turned 12, she knew that she'd want to become a choreographer. And so she requested that her gurus let her assist them so she could hone her skills. At the age of 16, she started her own studio, and she said, "Dance was always my one and only plan. I didn't have a plan or a plan B because I thought if I had a Plan B, I wouldn't be able to put 100 percent into either of the plans. I was very focused on joining the entertainment industry here."

However, while she was in her dance programme in college, she understood there was no positive representation of South Asians, Indians, or Indian culture, especially in dance. "Our Indian culture is so rich and beautiful, and I wanted to showcase it. That's when I changed my passion into having a very specific purpose, which was to elevate Indian dance culture in the West. That's how I kind of started to make the shift towards figuring out how to bridge the Indian classi-

cal forms of the East with the Western commercial forms in Hollywood. I relaunched my company as Joya Kazi Entertainment in Los Angeles," added the charming dancer, who is taking Indianness to global platforms.

With no opportunities initially, Joya faced her own challenges. Doing something no one ever thought of, she was creating all of the opportunities on her own and, in fact, pitching them to the directors of films and music videos to create opportunities for not only herself but also the dancers of her company. She shared, "The opportunities were always very few and far between. I wanted to show that Indian dance and art can be as commercial as Western art styles and can also create great work here in the West."

It was around 2017, when she came back to India for the first time and participated in *Star Plus's Dance+ Season 3*, under the mentorship of renowned choreographer Punit Pathak. Her love and passion for the arts gave her the opportunity to work with Allu Arjun in *Naa Peru Surya, Naa Illu India*. She further performed for the IIFA Awards with Madhuri Dixit, Hrithik Roshan, Priyanka Chopra Jonas, Siddharth Malhotra, Ranveer Singh, Amrita Rao, and many more from the industry. She has also worked on screen as well as in studio training with actors like Jacqueline Fernandez and Avantika Vandanapu, and has choreographed and done a lot of artist training for singers such as Rajakumari, Benny Dayal, AR Rahman, Gippy Grewal, Nick Cannon, Antonio Brown, and many more. The dancer is happy to be able to exercise so many different skills, perform, and put on so many hats.

If you've been a fan of Netflix's series *Never Have I Ever*, you surely would have seen Joya dancing so gracefully in season one. In episode four of season one, Joya not only choreographed the *Nagada Sang Dhol*

performance but also made her on-screen presence as Preeti in gorgeous, authentic Indian formalwear. And surely one cannot forget about the way the *mudras* were executed. One word: "BANG ON!"

"After over a decade of going from directors to production houses and pitching ideas, it was then that I got a call about whether I was interested in making it to the show. I did go in initially just as a try and to help with casting and virtual processes. But I got an email saying that the writer would love to have you on screen as well. I felt like I was juggling way too many responsibilities, but you know, I believe that when the universe offers you incredible opportunities, it's because it's time for you to level up, and it's a challenge that you definitely can't take on. I am really glad that I stepped up to the plate and was able to be a part of such an iconic and historical scene," shared Joya, who is also exploring and looking forward to what she can do as an actress and trying to push and challenge herself.

She has been the talk of the town for quite a while for her choreography in the iconic song *Saami Saami* from *Pushpa: The Rise*. Well, so much so that Rasmika Mandanna herself appreciated the performance.

"The amount of love that we've been receiving has been incredible. It was a no-brainer to come back for season four, of course. The producer sent me a message saying, 'It just makes sense to bring you back for the very last season. We wanted to include a song that was Tamil considering Devi's family is Tamil, and it just makes sense that *Saami Saami* was a part of a long list of options. We had to find something that had a female lead vocalist in it and that was popular and people enjoyed. Both Maitreyi and Richa had worked so hard in the amount of rehearsal time that was given. As creators of *Behind the Show*, we were for the very first time able to bring a Tollywood song to American television. We wanted to also pay tribute to the Global appeal of *Saami Saami* as India has so many different film industries and languages, and especially here in the West, we wanted to make sure that we showcased as many of these as possible in an American television show. So it's a great accomplishment for all of us to be able to have both Hindi and Tamil songs in this TV show," concluded the dancer.

Sir Geoffrey Boycott demands public apology from Australia

Legendary England opener Sir Geoffrey Boycott has demanded a public apology from the Australian team over the controversial stumping dismissal of Jonny Bairstow during their 43-run win in the second Ashes Test at Lord's.

On day five's play in the second Ashes Test at Lord's, Bairstow was on 10 in the 52nd over when he ducked under a bouncer from Cameron Green and inadvertently walked out of his crease.

On seeing that, Australia wicketkeeper Alex Carey immediately directed an underarm throw after catching the delivery,



That way it will redress the situation and everyone can then move on. 'These teams have played brilliant cricket in great spirit and it is a shame when something like that happens to spoil it all'.

"Australia have now had time to think about what happened. We all make mistakes in the heat of the moment. People will think better of the Australians if they put their hands up and say 'we got it wrong'. That is the way to go. Let's see over the next few days if they are man enough to do that."

"If you want to win at all costs then cricket should not be for you. We want people to play hard and fair but surely there are standards to uphold. When batsmen are not trying to take an advantage then you should not follow the letter of the law. Apply some common sense," wrote Boycott in his column for The Telegraph on Monday.

Aside from the Bairstow dismissal controversy, Australia are now leading the Ashes 2-0, and Boycott has urged England to not become the reason for their own downfall in the series, pointing out how they crumbled like a heap in the first innings at Lord's, giving away a 91-run lead. "Until this series, the England batting has been refreshing, exciting and injected new life into Test cricket. Even when scoring quickly the batsmen have looked in control with mainly proper cricket strokes. Suddenly in these last two Tests, they have lost their focus and their brains."



MCC issues apology to Australia

Australia defeated England and won the second Ashes Test at Lord's by 43 runs on Sunday to take a 2-0 lead in the five-Test series. The Ashes is one of the most iconic series that fans will witness, especially when matches are at Lord's, but recently the venue witnessed ugly scenes when a few MCC members abused two Australian players.

It was alleged by Australian players that a few MCC members abused the players when the team was on the way back to the dressing room after the first session of the final day. Right after the incident, The Aussies called for an investigation, to which MCC responded.

An Australian cricket spokesperson confirmed that the players and staff from the Australian team were verbally abused whereas some were physically contacted. He also revealed that Australian management has requested MCC to investigate the matter.

"Australian management has requested the Marylebone Cricket Club [MCC] investigate several incidents involving spectators in the members area during lunch on day five of the Lord's Test. It is alleged players and staff from the Australian team were verbally abused, with some being physically contacted, as they made their way to lunch through the members area", said a cricket Australia spokesperson.

MCC APOLOGISES TO THE AUSTRALIAN TEAM

After the match ended MCC issued an apologetic statement to the Australian team where they revealed that the three members are suspended till further investigation and that they will not enter the venue till the end of the inquiry.

"They will not be permitted back to Lord's whilst the investigation takes place and were informed of this by MCC

Chief Executive, Guy Lavender, this evening," the statement said.

"We maintain that the behaviour of a small number of members was completely unacceptable and whilst there was no suggestion by Pat Cummins in the post-match press conference that there was any physical altercation, it remains wholly unacceptable to behave in such a way which goes against the values of the club", he added.

The club further apologised to the Australian team for the incident.

"MCC condemns the behaviour witnessed and once again we reiterate our apology to Cricket Australia. We are thoroughly disappointed to be talking about poor behaviour when the Long Room as stated by Pat Cummins himself, is otherwise renowned for being 'really welcoming'. It has been a thrilling day to finish off a wonderful five days of Test cricket."

Spirit of cricket went out the window: Ian Smith

It led to chaos in the middle as Bairstow believed the ball was dead, with Australia immediately going for an appeal. On-field umpires Ahsan Raza and Chris Gaffaney sent the decision upstairs, where TV umpire Marais Erasmus confirmed Bairstow's dismissal.

Khawaja Breaks Silence On Lord's Long Room Incident

The red-ball Ashes battle between England and Australia is taking place in England these days where for the first time since 2016-17, the hosts are aiming to reclaim the Ashes. "It was really disappointing. Lord's is one of my favourite places to come. There's always respect shown at Lord's, particularly in the Members Pavilion in the Long Room, but there wasn't today. It was very disappointing," Khawaja said.

"If anyone asked me where the best place is to play I always say Lord's. The crowd is great, particularly the members are great, and some of the stuff that was coming out of the members' mouths is really disappointing and I wasn't just going stand by and cop it. So I just talked to a few of them. A few of them

throwing out some pretty big allegations and I just called them up on it and they kept going, and I was like, well, this is your membership here. So I'm just pointing them out. But it's pretty disrespectful, to be honest. I just expect a lot better from the members", Khawaja added.

SL creates history, beats NZ in WODI series

Captain Chamari Athapaththu slammed an unbeaten 140 to lead Sri Lanka to their first-ever ODI series victory over New Zealand. By winning the third ODI by eight wickets via the DLS method at the Galle International Cricket Stadium on Monday, Sri Lanka have won the series 2-1.

In the match, rain arrived yet again, leaving New Zealand's total at 127/2 in 31 overs. Electing to bat first, New Zealand lost Bernadine Bezuidenhout early and Amelia Kerr for 19. But Suzie Bates (63 not out off 87 balls) and captain Sophie Devine (38 not out off 48 balls) joined forces for rebuilding the innings.

The veteran pair added an unbroken 74 for the third wicket partnership, hitting five boundaries between themselves before a long interruption caused by rain brought their innings to an end.

When the rain finally stopped, Sri Lanka were handed a revised target of 196 in 29 overs. The hosts didn't have the best of starts to the chase as Vishmi Gunaratne (0) and Harshitha Samarawickrama (3) fell in quick succession.



But Chamari Athapaththu, who scored a century at this venue against the White Ferns last week, launched a stunning counterattack, reaching her eighth ODI century in just 60 deliveries, which is also the fourth fastest hundred in women's ODIs.

Overall, she slammed 13 fours and nine sixes at a strike rate of 175 in her aggressive knock of 140 not out to seal a historic win with eight wickets in hand and 13 balls to spare. Her nine sixes are joint most maximums hit in a women's ODI innings. Interestingly, all women's ODI hundreds from Sri Lanka have been hit by Athapaththu.

England name 15-member squad for third Test

England has resisted making sweeping changes by sticking with many of their regulars as they named a 15-man squad for the third Ashes Test in Headingley, starting from July 6, with Rehan Ahmed and Matty Potts dropping out.

The fitness of a pair of key players will be monitored in the lead-up to the third Ashes Test, with top-order batter Ollie Pope set to undergo scans on his troublesome shoulder and experienced spinner Moeen Ali still in some doubt with his finger problem. Ahmed was added to England's squad for the Lord's Test as cover for Moeen, but the teenager drops out of the reckoning for the Headingley Test in what appears a good sign for Moeen's fitness.

Pope hurt his right shoulder during England's 43-run loss to Australia in the second Test at Lord's and selectors will be hoping the 25-year-old is fit to take on the tourists in the crucial third Test.

If Pope is ruled out then it is likely Dan Lawrence will earn a place in England's XI, with the right-hander the only spare batter in the squad that selectors named on Sunday.

The dropping of Potts sug-



gests Mark Wood or Chris Woakes will come into the XI at Headingley. England are almost certain to rotate their attack to manage Jimmy Anderson's, Stuart Broad's and Ollie Robinson's workload, who have played in the first two Tests.

Australia have won the opening two matches of the five-Test series and England need to triumph in the remaining three

contests to regain the urn and become just the second team to come from 2-0 down to claim an Ashes series victory.

Lyon ruled out of remainder of the series

Premier spin bowler Nathan Lyon has been ruled out of the remainder of the Ashes series after suffering a significant calf tear, with Australia confirming two squad changes ahead of the third Test, starting on July 6 at Headingley.

Lyon suffered the injury while fielding on the second day of the Lord's Test. He didn't bowl in the match thereafter but hobbled from the field at Lord's on Thursday evening with what was later diagnosed as a significant calf strain.

The diagnosis was confirmed on Monday when Australia trimmed their squad from 18 to 16 for the upcoming third Test. This brought to an end his remarkable streak of 100 consecutive Tests. Lord's was his 100th Test in a row and his 122nd overall. He is just the sixth man in Test history to play 100 Tests in a row and the only bowler to do it.

The 35-year-old has also never missed a Test through injury until now. The Headingley Test will be the first one Lyon will miss since Lord's in 2013, when he was omitted for the first two Tests.



Reserve batter Matthew Renshaw has also been released from the Australian squad but will remain in England and be available should injury strike the touring party again.

No replacements have been included in the revised 16-player squad.

Lyon's absence opens the door for young spinner Todd Murphy, who won a place in the Ashes squad on the back of an impressive debut Test series in India earlier this year.

Australia coach Andrew McDonald has said Murphy was well placed to come straight into the XI for the third Test beginning on Thursday at Headingley after Lyon backed his young prodigy to hold his own in the Ashes cauldron.

"His stock ball is good enough in international cricket. We have seen that in India in arguably the hardest place to bowl spin," Lyon was quoted by cricket.com.au

"It will be a different challenge with the England batters. If they do come at him, it provides Todd with a decent challenge. But a chance to leave his footmarks here in England. It is a big Ashes series, he is excited by the opportunity," he said.

So, with the minute that fire went off being the best in the world, I felt like, what? What am I doing? So, what exactly is going on now? So was tough the last few years in that regard as well. I felt like, you know what, I can still have my super knock here and there, but I don't want to do that. I want to be the best", he added.
